It says the beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, as it is written in Isaiah the prophet Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way? The voice of one crying in the wilderness Prepare the way of the Lord, make his path straight.

John appeared, baptizing in the wilderness and proclaiming a baptism of repentance For the forgiveness of sins, and all the country of Judea and of the Jordan and Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. And now John was clothed with camel's hair and wore a leather belt around his waist, and he ate wild locust and honey. And he preached, saying After me comes one who is mightier than I, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy To stoop down and to untie. I have baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit. Would you join me in prayer this morning?
